

Invitation to the 2018 Joint Field Meeting of the:

Botanical Society of America, Northeastern Section Torrey Botanical Society & Philadelphia Botanical Club

May 20-24, 2018 (Sunday to Thursday) Millersville University, Lancaster County, PA

Each year the Botanical Society of America, the Torrey Botanical Society, and the Philadelphia Botanical Club sponsor a field meeting in an area of the northeastern United States. The 2018 meeting will explore Lancaster County, Pennsylvania and will be housed at Millersville University.

Lancaster County is famed for rich limestone habitats, including Shenk's Ferry, which has one of the best wildflower displays in the northeast. Nearby is the greatest concentration of serpentine sites in the northeast. Serpentine sites harbor a distinctive flora, including some plants that almost never grow off serpentine.

Field Trips

SERPENTINE BARRENS - Serpentine rocks are usually located deep beneath the earth's crust, but they were thrust to the surface at a series of sites near the Pennsylvania-Maryland state line (known as the state line barrens). Serpentine rocks give rise to soils that are chemically unique and toxic to many plants. Some rare plants, however, are well adapted to serpentine-based soils. We will visit fire-maintained serpentine prairies that have many of these rare plants, as well as rare animal species.

LOCK 12 AREA - Scouring by the Susquehanna River has exposed a bedrock shoreline. This rare geologic occurrence has created a scenic spot and habitat for many regionally uncommon and rare plants.

SHENKS FERRY PRESERVE - The rich soils of this limestone glen produce one of the region's most abundant and diverse displays of woodland wildflowers.

LANCASTER COUNTY CENTRAL PARK - This park has one of the area's few limestone cliffs, and it is habitat for many locally uncommon and rare plants.

WALNUT RUN - The rich diabase soils at this location support a very rich and diverse flora. The adjacent sandstone woodland forms a nice contrast, as it has a sparse flora characterized by ericaceous shrubs (i.e. members of the heath family).

MIDDLE CREEK AREA - This location has a fire-managed meadow, a reclaimed meadow, and acidic woodlands.

Facilities

We have access to a large room with several tables that will likely be available for plant ID after hours. If you want to bring a microscope, there are electrical outlets.

Lodging

Housing will be Millersville's **South Villages** dormitory. The rooms are called **double suites** (Google it if you want to see a floor plan). Each person will be able to have his/her own room and bathroom. The rooms have internet, but no TV or refrigerator. There are two beds in each room, but **you will only be able to use one bed** (using only one bed reduced the price by \$6.00/night). You will have to bring your own linens (sheets, pillowcases, towels, washcloths, blankets, soap, etc). The dorm has a key card and so does each room. If you lose the key, there is a fine of \$35.00. All keys **MUST** be returned.

Dining

Breakfasts and dinners will be served cafeteria style in the upper deck of Gordinier Hall. Breakfast is served from 7:00 to 8:00 am.

Lunch is box-style and will be picked up at breakfast.
