

FIELD TRIP SCHEDULE

All field trips start at 1:30 P.M. If you need more information than is given here, call our field trip chairman, Jasper Brown, at 364-8229.

Saturday, June 4 - Titus Bog

We visit our own bog, where the Arethusa is abundant, a most unusual sight. Meet at the rest stop on U. S. 6 and Rte. 89 between Union City and Corry. Leader, Bob Morgan.

Saturday, June 11 - Wolfe Creek

This will be a cooperative venture with the Ohio Mushroom Society. Emily Johnson will be leading a morning walk at/0:00 Å.M. and Howard McIlvried the afternoon walk at 1:30 P.M.

Leave I-79 at the Slippery Rock exit; drive toward the town on Rte. 108 for a mile or so. At the Dairy stand, turn left. Continue for a few miles to the first paved road. Turn right, passing a large dairy farm, and continue to a grassy triangle. At the grassy triangle, turn right and meet at the bridge, a few miles further. Park in the Slippery Rock College area on the right, just before the bridge.

Saturday, June 18 - Ernie's Esquire Inn

This was formerly the T. W. Phillips Mansion on Route 8, 6 miles south of Butler, 12 miles north of the Turnpike on the east side of the road. Our leader has found some specimens of <u>Stylophorum diphyllum</u>. This was reported some years ago in Western Pennsylvania, but not seen until now by our contemporaries. Whether it will still be in bloom is uncertain, but the plant and fruit should be present. It differs from Celandine by its noticeably long style. Watch for the Inn's sign at a conspicuous brick and iron gate. Park and meet at the Inn's parking area. Fred Lochner, leader.

Saturday, June 25 - McConnell's Mill

Enter the area from Rte. 422 about a halfmile west of U. S. 19. Meet at the large parking lot and picnic area above the mill. Virginia Craig, Leader.

Saturday, July 2 - North Park

Meet at the parking area along Wildwood Road, off Babcock Blvd., near the Dairy Queen Store. Hopefully, we will find some orchids. Esther Allen, Leader.

Saturday, July 9 - Mt. Davis

This will be a continuation of our plant survey of the area. Meet at the picnic area with a lunch. Water and restrooms as well as picnic tables are available. It is suggested that you watch for Mt: Davis signs in Meyersdale on Rte. 219. Mr. R. K. Ache, leader.
