Saturday, July 9 - Mt. Davis

This will be a continuation of our plant survey of the area. Meet at the picnic area with a lunch. Water and restrooms as well as picnic tables are available. It is suggested that you watch for Mt. Davis signs in Meyersdale on Rte. 219. Jasper Brown, leader.

Saturday, July 16 - Rockland Township

OGLEBAY WILDFLOWER CAMP


Highly recommended -- the Wildflower Weekend conducted each year by Brooks Nature Center at the Oglebay Camp in Terra Alta, West Virginia.
