

SIX CONSONANTS IN A ROW - ANSWER

In last month's bulletin, we posed the question as to which botanical genus contained six consecutive consonants. The answer is -

ESCHSCHOLZIA

That's the genus of the California Poppy. It was named for J. F. Eschscholz, who was not a botanist but a physician.

Chamisso, the German naturalist who found the California Poppy on San Francisco's sand dunes in 1816, named it for his expedition's surgeon, Eschscholz.
