9-8-90 - WALNUT CREEK Erie County, Pa. Leader: Tim Lyons


From Pittsburgh, take I-79 north into Erie County and I-90 west to the first exit - Route 832. Meet at the south edge of the Best Western Motel parking lot.

9-29-90 - CRANESVILLE SWAMP NATURE PRESERVE Preston County, WV & Garrett County, MD Leader: Dr. Ken Carvell

From Pittsburgh, take I-79 south past Morgantown, WV and Rte. 48 east to Exit 20 - Cheat Lake. Meet at the bottom of the exit ramp.

Dr. Carvell is a retired West Virginia University forestry professor, who possesses a vast knowledge of both the flora and natural history of West Virginia. He will provide us with a tour of Cranesville Swamp that will include a discussion of its history and some of its late summer flora. <u>Gentiana quinquefolia</u> (Stiff Gentian), <u>Bartonia virginica</u> (Yellow Bartonia), and cranberries are some of the botanical specimens we will see.
