APRIL MEETING

April 3, 1993 -- Wildflower Reserve, Raccoon State Park Starting Time: 1:30 P.M. Leader: Jeanne Poremski

Directions: Take Rt. 30 west through Imperial. Travel approx. 7 miles to the Reserve on the right immediately before the park entrance. Meet in the parking area. Unless there is a foot of snow on the ground, we will see snow trillium, harbinger of spring, blue staining fungus, and other stalwarts.

April 10, 1993--Easter--No field trip scheduled

April 17, 1993--Core Arboretum at West Virginia Univ. Starting Time: 12:00 Noon Leader: Clete Smith

Directions: Take I-79 south into West Virginia and exit at Star City. Turn left and proceed a short distance to Rt. 7. Turn right on Rt. 7 and continue toward Morgantown. About 1/4 mile past the WVU Colosseum, turn right at the sign directing you to the arboretum. Meet in the parking area. We will see how the late, snowy spring has affected the timing of the wildflowers. Will we see early or late bloomers?

BOTANICAL FIELD MEETING TO BE AT MILLERSVILLE, PA, JUNE 20-24

The Annual Joint Field Meeting of the Northeastern Section of the Botanical Society of America, the Philadelphia Botanical Club, and the Torrey Botanical Club, will be held on June 20 to June 24 (Sunday to Thursday) at Millersville University in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, in association with the Muhlenberg Botanical Society.

Field trips are planned to a variety of habitats in eastern Fennsylvania, including serpentine barrens, Triassic uplands, and forests along the Susquehanna River. Evening programs will deal with aspects of the flora visited, with the geology of the region, and with the management of threatened species.

The cost will be \$165.00 per person, double occupancy; this includes eleven meals and four night's housing, plus trips, local transportation, and evening programs. Space is limited and prior registration is required.
