FIELD TRIPS

September 3, 1994--Harrisonville Shale Barrens. Lutzville, Bedford & Fulton Counties

Starting Time: 12 NOON *note time*

Leader: Jeanne Poremski

Directions: From Pittsburgh, take the Turnpike to Breezewood and exit east onto Rt. 30 toward McConnellsburg. Travel 11 miles to Harrisonville at the intersection of Rts. 30 and 655. Continue east on 30; when the road bends to the left at the shale barrens,

park on the left.

Expectations: This is a return to three separate sites that are quite exciting. The species list at Harrisonville is very long; the second site includes six different ferns growing in dry rocks, including Blunt Lobed Woodsia (Woodsia obtusa). We might find a fence lizard as well. Lutzville offers limestone species as well as several not found in western Pennsylvania, such as Northern Blazing Star (Liatris borealis), Northern Prickly Ash (Xanthoxylum americanum), Wall Rue (Asplenium ruta-muraria), and Purple Cliff Brake (Pellaea atropurpurea). This will be an intensive day, so note the earlier starting time.

October 1, 1994 -- Moraine State Park

Starting Time: 1 P.M. Leader: Esther Allen

Directions: From I-79N, take the Portersville exit and turn left toward Rte. 19. Take Rte. 19 north and after passing Rte. 488 on the left, take a road that goes off to the right in a Y (West Park Drive). After going over Rte. 422, travel less than a mile to the bicycle rental area on North Shore Drive.

Expectations: This will also make for a long species list including Nodding Ladies'

Tresses (Spiranthes cernua).

This is not the very, very special program that we promised you in last month's Wildflowers. That will come in October.


FOR BETTER OR FOR WORTS
