This is a wet location but not one where deep holes are encountered; expect to get wet feet.

# MARKLEYSBURG BOG FIELD TRIP

The August 5th trip to Markleysburg Bog was a great success. Despite stormy weather in the Pittsburgh area the clouds parted over the bog and six enthusiastic plantseekers were rewarded with sunshine and a fine array of wild plants. We found 3 unusual kinds of St. Johnswort, teaberry, trailing arbutus, seedbox, cross-leaved milkwort, cotton grass, many interesting ferns and mushrooms, three Lycopodiums, round-leaved sundew in bud, bartonia, Aster radula, and a great number of capsulated Malazis unifolia plants in the bog. We agreed that it was too bad that the large pond was drained, and that so many members missed this rewarding trip. - Phullis Monk
