Field Trip Schedule

Saturday, March 29, 1997 -

Crouse Run, Allegheny County Leader: Esther Allen Time: 1:00

Directions: From Pittsburgh, take Rte 28 to **Rte 8 North.** Travel 6.6 miles to make a left on Craighead Road. (This left turn is about 0.7 miles after Harts Run Road). Travel Craighead Road 0.2 miles, then make a left at the North Hills Church of Nazarene. After 0.4 miles, make a right onto Sample Road. Travel 0.7 miles to a highway bridge over Crouse Run and park on left just before Royal View Road. If you cross a second highway bridge over Willow Creek you've gone too far.

Expectations: Snow Trillium, and maybe snow! Be prepared for several stream crossings...waterproof boots are recommended.

Saturday,

April 5, 1997 -

Raccoon Creek State Park, Beaver Cty Leader: Esther Allen Time: 1:00

Directions: From Pgh, take **I-279 south/US 22-30** (Parkway West). After about 7.5 miles, exit this highway to continue west on **U.S. 22-30**. After 3.9 miles, exit this highway to continue on **U.S. 30** (**Imperial exit**). 9.5 miles from this exit, watch for the entrance for the Wildflower Reserve, on the right, just over the hill. Meet in the parking lot.

Saturday, April 12, 1997 -

Duff Park, Allegheny County Leader: Veronique Schreurs Time: 1:00

Directions: From Pittsburgh, take **Rte 22** East (Parkway East) past Monroeville, to **Murrysville**. Make a **right onto School Road** at a red light just before the Sheetz Shrine Gas Station. Traveling about 1/8 of a mile, **cross the bridge** over Turtle Creek, and park in the parking lot on the right.

Expectations: Spring wildflowers among century-old oaks.

Saturday,

April 19, 1997 - Cedar Creek County Park, Westmoreland Cty Leader: Mark Bowers Time: 1:00

Directions: Meet in the parking lot of Howard Johnson's (on the left side of the road when going south on Rte. 51) at the **intersection of Rte.** 51 South and I-70.

Sunday,

April 27, 1997 -

Enlow Forks Natural Area, Greene County Leader: Bob Morgan Time: 1:00

Directions: I-79 south to **I-70 west.** Proceed 11.6 miles to the **Claysville** exit (**Exit 2**). At the stop sign at the bottom of the exit ramp, turn right and right again on U.S. 40 towards **Claysville**. At center of town, 0.8 mile, turn right just beyond Sacred Heart Church on **PA 231 South**. Proceed 3.5 miles to a **fork;** PA 231 goes left, but you should **bear right** on the high road toward Good Intent and West Finley. Continue 8 miles into West Finley. At the **stop sign** in West Finley **bear left** towards Graysville. Cross the bridge over Enlow Fork after 2.4 miles, and turn right immediately onto a small bridge. Follow the dirt road 1.6 miles;

Take **Rte 66 north** (right) to **Apollo**. Cross the Kiskiminetas River into Apollo. After crossing the bridge you will see a traffic light, and a shopping center to the left. Park in the lot; we will meet in the corner of the lot closest to the bridge.
