# Next Meeting is October 9th at the A. J. Palumbo Hall

The next meeting will be Monday, October 9, 8:00 p.m., at Carlow College, 3333 Fifth Avenue, Pittsburgh, PA (Oakland).

Our speaker will be **Esther Allen.** She will present "Insects: Friends and Foes". This program will demonstrate the relationships, good and bad, between insects and plants.

Esther is an active member who leads dozens and dozens of field trips and presents nature and botanical programs all over the area. Do not miss her informative program!

For this month only, we will meet at the A.J. Palumbo Hall, located next to the campus between Fifth and Forbes Avenues. As you approach the campus on Fifth Avenue (heading toward downtown Pittsburgh), do not turn right into the Carlow Campus entrance. #### Three Questions from the President

Members of the Botanical Society are designing a book of the area's wildflowers. The book includes plant descriptions and color photographs by various members.

President Haywood is asking members for some hearty suggestions:

- 1. What should the title of the book be?
- 2. To whom should the book be dedicated?

To make the book affordable, the Botanical Society would like to print at least 5000 copies to keep the production cost for each individual book low. But it will cost a lot to produce 5000 to 10,000 copies. Additional fund-raising is necessary.

To raise funds, Dr. Haywood has donated a copy of *Wild Flowers of Western Pennsylvania and the Upper Ohio Basin* by O.E. Jennings and Andrey Avinoff. All members will soon be receiving a set of raffle tickets in the mail for this wonderful book. Please do your best to sell these tickets, and remember to buy some for yourself.

This two volume set contains outstanding watercolor prints by Andrey Avinoff. Dr. O.E. Jennings, master botanist, presents a descriptive flora of western Pennsylvania. This rare out-ofprint treasure can now only be found at used booksellers, and usually commands \$300 to \$600.

Dr. Haywood also promises a great prize to the person who sells the most raffle tickets.

The Hardy Fern Foundation has published the Directory of Fern Gardens, Nurseries and Reserves in the United States and Canada.

This book is edited by one of our own members-Joan E. Gottlieb. The *Directory of Fern Gardens* has 206 entries, nineteen of which are in Pennsylvania.

All of the gardens and reserves are open to the public (through regular hours or by appointment). Most of the listed places have general collections or displays of native or exotic plants, but all have interesting and extensive fern holdings.
